DIRECTOR'S NOTE

The Tony-nominated *Blues in the Night* takes place on the South Side of Chicago in 1938 in a once popular hotel. This piece is set in Chicago because it's the birthplace of the Blues and has always been home to the very best of Jazz music, both forms you'll experience in this performance. This musical revue, conceived by Sheldon Epps in 1980, is strung together with songs by some of the great music artists of the past century: Harold Arlen, Johnny Mercer, Billy Strayhorn, Alberta Hunter and Bessie Smith, to name a few.

There are three women who live in the hotel. "The Lady from the Road," who is wise and the root of the hotel. She has seen it all, knows it all and comes from The Chitlin' Circuit where she was once a star in the days of vaudeville. She is searching for that memory again. "The Woman of the World," who is back for a memory of days gone by when her husband brought her here as an anniversary and she is trying to recapture that time again now without him. And "The Girl on a Date" who is looking for a new beginning as she is searching for her renewed self. Will she find it or will she continue to search? "The Man in the Saloon," who is the singer in the hotel, has troubles at home with his wife and tries to search for his younger self when he was carefree. "The Dancing Man" (a new creation for this production) connects with all of these people throughout the hotel in various ways as he tells his own story through dance. These people are connected through this amazing music and storytelling that gives us *Blues in the Night*.

I hope you enjoy this production as much as I have had researching, rehearsing and now, sharing it with you.

In addition, Governor Pat Quinn declared July 24, 2007 "Felicia P. Fields Day." Fields' performance as "Sofia" also garnered her a 2006 Theatre World Award, a Clarence Derwent Award, two Broadway.com awards, an NAACP nomination, a Denver Post Ovation Award and a Drama League honoree. He received a full scholarship to study Jazz and Classical bass at the University of Illinois Urbana after which performing with many jazz legends including McCoy Tyner, Nancy Wilson, Stanley Turrentine, and Chicago legend Chalib Challab. Later Rafe became an original member of the Tom Joyner Morning Show Live-House Band where he was privileged to perform with Luther Vandross, Mavis Staples and others. Many TV commercials followed with the famous voices of Barry White, CeCe Winans, Patti Austin, and the Oprah show theme with Patti LaBelle. In recent years you could catch Rafe on NBC's the Bonnie Hunt Show where he performed with Late Night's Paul Shaffer and drumming legend Harvey Mason. Now back in Chicago, Rafe has been the bass foundation for many Jeff nominated musicals.

RICARDO JIMENEZ⁺ (Trumpet) is a trumpet player, jazz vocalist, and educator in Chicago, IL. He is a recent graduate of Lawrence University, Appleton, WI, where he received a Bachelor of Arts in Biology and a Bachelor of Music in Trumpet Performance. At Lawrence University, he was the principal trumpet in both the Lawrence Symphony Orchestra, the Lawrence University Wind Ensemble, and lead trumpet in the Lawrence University Jazz Ensemble. Porchlight has built a national reputation for boldly reimagining classic musicals, supporting new works and young performers, and showcasing Chicago's most notable music theatre artists, all through the intimate and powerful theatrical lens of the "Chicago Style."

Porchlight Music Theatre is proud to be a member of the vibrant Ruth Page Center for the Arts community and an Artist In-Residence. Central to the Ruth Page Center for the Arts' programming is the Artists In-Residence program, which is designed to serve organizations looking for a home base while they grow or expand their artistic and organizational capabilities. The Center is committed to nurturing and assisting dance and other performing artists, allowing for exchange and collaborative relationships to develop within the artistic community. The Ruth Page Center for the Arts is a destination for quality performing arts, accessible to a wide community regardless of race, gender, age, education or disability. An incubator of artistic energy and excellence, the Ruth Page Center for the Arts carries forward the vision of its founder, legendary dance icon Ruth Page, to be a platform for developing great artists and connecting them with audiences and community.

Now in its 27th season, Porchlight's production history includes more than 70 mainstage works with 15 Chicago premieres and five world premieres. Porchlight's commitment to the past, present and future of music theatre led the company to develop the Porchlight Revisits and New Faces Sing Broadway program series; both are quickly becoming audience favorites.

Porchlight's education and outreach programs serve schools, youth of all ages and skill levels and community organizations, most notably the ongoing collaboration with Chicago Youth Centers. Porchlight annually awards dozens of full scholarships and hundreds of free tickets to ensure accessibility and real engagement with this uniquely American art form.

The company's many honors include 178 Joseph Jefferson Award (Jeff) nominations and 45 Jeff awards, as well as 33 Black Theatre Alliance (BTA) nominations and 12 BTA awards.
